However I do still feel that we as an older group are only tolerated and not made to feel part of these events.


Well we are all up for great change this year at MAG with our move to the new ACON building in Elizabeth Street.

ACON will be moving to new premises located at **414 Elizabeth Street, Surry Hills, possibly in May**. The nearest cross street to 414 Elizabeth Street is Devonshire Street. People who travel by **train to reach MAG's new home** will now alight at Central Railway Station, exit at the Devonshire Street exit. Turn left **when you leave the station's concourse; go up the stairs or by new elevator** [when it becomes operational], cross Chalmers Street at the pedestrian traffic lights, walk up the small incline past the Irish Pub, to Elizabeth Street. Then cross at the lights, and on the other side turn to the left and 414 Elizabeth Street is just there. There are approx 347 paces from the ticket barrier to the front door.

You look for **Café 414** and the **7 Eleven store**, the entrance to our *new home* is in between these two premises.

An Obituary printed in the London Times — interesting and sadly rather true.

Today we mourn the passing of a beloved old friend, **Common Sense**, who has been with us for many years. No one knows for sure how old he was, since his birth records were lost in bureaucratic red tape.

He will be remembered as having cultivated such valuable lessons as:

Knowing when to come in out of the rain;

Common Sense finally gave up the will to live, after a woman failed to realise that a steaming cup of tea was hot. She spilled a little in her lap, and was promptly awarded a huge settlement.

Common Sense was preceded in death, by his parents, **Truth** and **Trust**, by his wife, **Discretion**, by his daughter, **Responsibility** and by his son, **Reason**.
