Marcantonio's Mango and Pistachio Homemade Popsicles



Introduction:

In 1994 our sons were going through their Werewolf years [puberty] and testosterone and hormonal mood surges were a daily occurrences. And as gay parents, all we could do is smile encouragingly, tell them that everything is fine and normal and hand them a roll of paper towels to clean up the mess. They also became acutely body conscience so they insisted on low sugar and natural food meals or desserts. Swapping notes with another gay dad we came up with this highly nutritious dessert that met the approval of our developing sons. So much so that it became a popular favourite when the fresh mango season came about. Ok not all of you have testosterone and hormonal moody teenagers to deal with but this little wonder is a great treat to serve up this summer as El Niño hits. So try this out and enjoy.

Ingredients:

- 01. 1 1/3 cup THICK Greek Yogurt
- 02. Can Mango Nectar Concentrate
- 03. 1 ripe mango, peeled and chopped [about 1 1/2 cups]
- 04. 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 05. 1/4 teaspoon ground cardamom
- 06. l tablespoon crystallized ginger, chopped
- 07. 1/2 cup chopped pistachios

Preparation: Prep Time: 5 minutes active time. Serves: 12

- 01. Pour the all ingredients, minus the pistachios, into a blender. Cover and blend until mostly smooth.
- 02. Sprinkle with pistachios and gently fold into the mix then spoon into 12 regular sized Popsicle moulds.
- 03. Freeze till nearly solid. Then push a Popsicle stick into the centre of each pop and sprinkle with extra pistachios and press gently.
- 04. Place back in the freezer until solid. To loosen, place the mould up-side-down under warm running tap water.
