It is with regret that we announce the passing of Harry West OAM. Harry was 92 years old & was our oldest living Member before his *passing*.
He had only been to a few meetings of late, but was interested in what was at MAG. To John we extend our deepest sympathies.
A number of members were at his funeral to say "farewell". Harry met John O'Dea at one of our meetings some 23 years ago & they clicked & became soul mates & partners from then.
Harry was well respected by the members of not only MAG, but of the Papua New Guinea Assoc of Australia. He was awarded the Order of Australia Medal in 2009 for his services to that body.

Harry was a Greeter for MAG meetings at Commonwealth Street. He would welcome you, wrote your name tag & made sure that you *were looked after* by having someone help show you the ropes — to make you feel welcomed.

<u>Marcantonio's Tasmanian Style Ham Hock and</u> Apple Casserole.

Introduction:

It's mid-winter in Sydney. It's dark. It's cold. The wind and rain are beating against the windows. Inside, you're seating with your feet up on a footstool all rugged up, nice and warm. You're watching a Channing Tatum movie. There is also the dead weight of 30kilos of German Shepard sleeping contentedly across your lap. All the while, you're aware that from the kitchen emanates the delicious aroma of spice, sage and apple. This is winter comfort food at its best. So this is that recipe...

Prep time: 25 min. Cook time: 1 hr 45 min. Serves: 4

Ingredients:

- 4 tbsp vegetable oil
- 4 ham hocks
- 1 red onion, sliced
- 1 clove garlic, chopped
- 4 large red apples
- 600 ml Menorval Calvados [a good sweet cider will do at a pinch]
- 1 tbsp wholegrain dry mustard, cracked and lightly ground
- 1 tbsp Manuka honey
- 100 ml double cream
- 6 sage leaves [fresh not dried], chopped, to garnish

Preparation:

Heat the oil in a deep, lidded casserole and fry the ham hocks until golden. Remove the ham and set to one side.

Add the red onion, garlic, and apples to the pan. Cook until slightly softened and then cover with the Calvados. Mix in the mustard and honey, then cover and leave to cook for 90 minutes.

Remove the ham hocks and place on a serving dish. Bring the cooking juices to the boil and add the cream. Cook until reduced and thickened, until you get a beautifully rich consistency. Pour over the ham, garnish with the sage leaves.

Serving suggestions:

Serve with hunks of warm sourdough bread along with a glass of either a Merlot, a Cider or that Calvados.

Pics & info on Harry West

We are pleased to publish some pics of Harry, that were captured over the years he was a MAG Member. An interesting photo of Harry was taken on the occasion of Harry's 87th & John Charles' 80th birthday celebrations in 2009. We summonsed a *Police Officer* to arrest John for turning 80; the Officer then started to remove his uniform. We got a bit worried when John & Harry got near this Police Officer – what was going to happened to his blue G string?

At Harry's funeral we were told of some interesting facts on him - in World War II, Harry was a private in the AIF at 19 years of age, and a Lieutenant in ANGAU a few years later. At the end of the War in 1945, he took up a new career, one that was very similar to his Army role, he joined the Civil Administration in PNG. He was appointed as a Patrol Officer, and the associated roles of magistrate, officer of police, inspector of labour, licker of stamps etc. He was then appointed as an Assistant District Officer, a District Officer, then District Commissioner in Rabaul, New Britain, the Australian Liaison Officer in Dutch New Guinea, Australia's Special Representative to the Trusteeship Council, and ultimately the Head of the Department. Harry's contribution to Papua New Guinea went unrecognised by the Australian Government. He and his achievements are, and will always be, a more significant and a lasting memorial than any other. Masta West or Mata 'arry as he was called in PNG was admired, respected and loved by all who knew him: black, brown and white.

As a friend of Harry's, Bill Brown MBE said of him at his funeral service – Harry was not a big man, he was not a small man, but Harry was a great man. He was also a kind man, a thoughtful man, and a generous man. All who knew Harry would certainly agree with Bill's sentiments!!
